The American Saddlebred Association of Great Britain (ASAOGB) is delighted to announce the acquisition by the Visions Saddlebred Stud of a new stallion. On 15th May, Sand Attache's Leading Admiral, arrived from Indiana, having made the journey down to Lexington for the 30-day quarantine, and then back up to Chicago for the flight across the Atlantic to England. He spent an overnight in Shannon, Ireland, and then came across by ferry and road to Newmarket. His new owner, Cheryl Lutring, collected him and brought him down to her facility in East Sussex, which is also the headquarters of the ASAOGB.

Admiral, a gaited dark chestnut, is by Courageous Admiral and out of a mare by Attache. His dam's maternal grandsire is Oman's Desdemona Denmark – a decisive link for Cheryl as her very first five-gaited imported horse, Rare Visions, was a granddaughter of that stallion. *Admiral* certainly lives up to his reputation of exemplary manners, classic conformation and enchanting temperament. He has not put a foot wrong and has settled in beautifully, enjoying being turned out with his small band of mares – all fingers are crossed for some fine babies next year.
